Blackbirds



<u>Owls</u>


On Wednesday Owls went to Staindrop Academy for an Orienteering event and the children enjoyed using their observational skills to find items and locate them on a map.

What is the Water Cycle and How Does It Work?

This week, our brilliant Year 3 and 4 pupils have been on a scientific adventure to answer a big question: What is the water cycle and how does it work? Through hands-on learning and creative thinking, the children explored key processes like evaporation, condensation, precipitation, and accumulation discovering how water moves around our planet in a never-ending cycle. To bring their learning to life, they worked together to create amazing 3D diagrams that show the water cycle in action! From fluffy cotton wool clouds to blue rivers and labelled arrows, every part of their models tells a story of how water changes and travels. We're so proud of their curiosity, teamwork, and fantastic explanations. Not only do they now know what the water cycle is they can tell you exactly how it works! Ask them to show you their model and explain the process - you'll be impressed!
